
To Enroll your Child...

Arrange an interview with the FCC Coordinator (or their designee) to discuss child care needs, provider qualifications and program procedures.

For full time care, interview providers from the referral list to select the proper care for your child. Complete required forms and submit to your FCC provider. Required Forms:

- AF Form 1181, Air Force Youth Flight Program Patron Registration
- AF Form 357, Family Care Certification for dual and single military parents
- DD Form 2652, Application for DoD Child Care Fees
- Copy of your leave and earnings statement (LES)
- Copy of immunization records

To take advantage of any of the Expanded Child Care programs, you must pre-qualify/register:

Extended Duty Care: Obtain written verification from your supervisor stating that you may need to work beyond the 50-hour work week or may experience temporary shift changes.

Child Care for PCS: Obtain PCS Certificate from Relocation Office in A&FRC. (722-1123)

Returning Home Care: Present a copy of your orders to the FCC Coordinator.

Volunteer Child Care: Obtain Volunteer Certificate from A&FRC

If forms are already on file at CDC, SAP or a FCC home, copies are acceptable. Contact the FCC Coordinator to make specific reservations for the days and times care is needed.

The Diversity of Family Child Care

The Air Force Child Development Program plays a significant role in supporting mission readiness and increasing the retention rate of Airmen. This includes Child Development Centers (CDC), School Age Programs (SAP) and Family Child Care (FCC) Homes.

SJAFB's Family Child Care (FCC) program features specially trained and licensed providers who offer in-home care in their base-housing quarters and approved affiliated homes. These professionals have age-appropriate toys, educational materials and safety items provided by the FSS Family Child Care resource library. Children in the FCC program range from 2-weeks to 12 years of age.

The FCC Coordinator supports the program by ensuring child care providers at SJAFB are screened, trained, and licensed to provide child care. The FCC Coordinator monitors the homes and conducts unannounced inspections including inspections during extended hours of operation.

The FCC program accepts children for care who have chronic health problems, developmental delays, and children who are HIV-positive. Individuals with chronic health concerns, including those who are HIV-positive, may also be approved as FCC providers.



Extended Duty Care is available to military members and authorized DoD civilians who need child care on a temporary basis over the allotted 50 hours a week families are already purchasing. Acceptable use includes any extended duty day as a result of exercises, weekend work, temporary shift changes and rapid mobilization. This program offers care in a licensed family child care (FCC) home and is **free** at SJAFB.

Child Care for PCS is a relatively new Air Force Aid Society funded program. Families with PCS orders can obtain a PCS Certificate from the base Relocation Office in the Airman and Family Readiness Center. Families may use up to 20 hours for **free** in a Family Child Care (FCC) home for each child between 60 days prior to move and 60 days after move. Certificates are only good at the base they are issued. Contact the A&FRC at 722-1123 for more information on this program.

One of the hallmarks of the FCC system is its ability to tailor care to the unique needs of military families. In addition to providing care to children while their parents work, SJAFB FCC offers EDC, PCS, RHC, Volunteer, RHC and EDC programs.

Returning Home Care offers 16 hours of **free** care per child for children 12 and under in an FCC home. Active duty members returning from a 30-day or more deployment in support of the Global War on Terrorism are eligible.

Volunteer Child Care in FCC homes is offered for free while you volunteer at one of the many base worksites listed at the Airman and Family Readiness Center (A&FRC). The Air Force Aid Society (AFAS) funds this program to volunteers who pre-qualify. Call A&FRC at 722-1123 for more information on this program.

Subsidy is for full-time care (35-50 hours). Payment is subsidized for children 2 years and under. Parents will pay the same rate for their subsidized space as they would if their child was enrolled in the base Child Development Center.
