Maguey Piatas/ Noche -Buena

The star Piñta is one of the most traditional elements of the Christmas season in Mexico. This Piñta holds great significance at each of its peaks. Its seven peaks symbolize the seven deadly sins: greed, pride, lust, gluttony, wrath, laziness, envy. The bows with the stick means to destroy them. The candies and fruit are the reward for destroying these sins. The blindfold represents the blind faith in being able to destroy evil and attain good.



Materials:

1 foam ball

Paint (1 color in sauce cup/pack)

Glue (1 sauce cup/pack)

1 colorful card stock paper/craft

6 tooth picks

1 pipe cleaner

6 tissue paper (2in squares)



Paint or color the foam ball a color of your choice

Cut a corner of cardstock into a half circle and roll into a cone and glue to secure. You should have seven mini cones all together.

Glue or tape thin strips of tissue paper to tip of cone for fringe. Glue or tape cone to toothpick. Stick toothpick into foam ball.

Cute pipe cleaner in half and push into the top and bottom of the foam to act as a hanger.

Customize piñata to your liking with pom -poms.



1) Use your finger and score along all the dotted score lines

 Use scissors to cut out the diamond shapes (like in picture below) An easy way to do this is to fold along the score line at either end of your cracker and make two snips with a pair of scissors for each diamond.


3) Bring one end together and tie with ribbon or string.

DIY Kwanzaa Kinara!

Materials: Scissors

Tape or glue

Orange tissue paper

Red, green and black craft paper

Directions:

- 1. You'll need three red, three green and one black (the tallest sheet of craft paper.)
- 2. Glue or tape craft paper into tubes.
- 3. Make sure that one of your tubes is a bit taller than the others. If they're all the same height, cut an inch or two of six tubes so that one is taller than the rest.
- 4. Use brown card stock as the base.
- 5. Glue or tape the tubes together in a row with the tallest tube in the center
- 6. Secure to base to finish your kinara!

ST. NICHOLAS DAY PROMISE CARD

THE SPIRIT OF CHRISTMAS

St. N icholas was a bishop who lived a long time ago. T here are many legends about N icholas. O ne story tells how he threw three bags of gold into the house of a very poor man who had three daughters. N icholas wanted to make sure the three girls would be taken care of. T his card celebrates generous St. N icholas by illustrating three of his qualities: concern for justice (fairness), care for others (charity & generosity), and love of G od that motivated all his good deeds.

M AT ERIALS Construction paper strip 9 x 3 inches Copy of pattern

E Q U IPM EN T S cissors Markers or crayons G lue

DIRECTIONS

- Fold construction paper strip into thirds, making a folded piece 3 inches wide (see diagram).
- Place paper pattern on folded paper, making sure straight sides are along the folds. D raw around pattern, or hold and cut away the paper from the top and the bottom of the pattern, being careful not to cut the folds. U nfold to show three bags in a row (see diagram).
- Color, cut out, and glue the miter to the front cover of the folded card.
- Inside, on each bag, write one N icholas quality (Justice, C harity, and Love of G od); add your own promise how you will live like N icholas. For example, for Justice, to play fair; for C harity, to share your toys; for Love of G od, to pray every day.
